I hope the district is enjoying the trial membership. It appears that Fair Oaks Cemetery would fall under <u>category</u> 12 (\$750k-\$1M) based on the district's annual operating revenue. If that figure is incorrect, I would be happy to create a revised estimate for the district.

Annual membership dues for category 12 would be \$3,391. After a one-time joining promotional discount of 20%, dues would amount to \$2,713. (2025 membership renewal would be prorated, as a portion of the joining payment would be applied toward the 2025 membership year renewal)
